CCD Health Measures: In an effort to keep the students healthy, the CCD program will be observing the same health measures that are in place at East Butler. The doors to the hall will be locked until after Mass. The children will have their temperature taken before CCD; 7th and 8th grade students are asked to have their temperature taken at the hall before going to the rectory basement. If East Butler does not have school (for health reason) on a Friday before CCD or on a Monday after CCD there will be no CCD classes that week.

Dispensation from Obligation to Attend Sunday

Mass: As a reminder, the Archbishop has dispensed all Catholic in the Diocese of Lincoln from their obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days.
